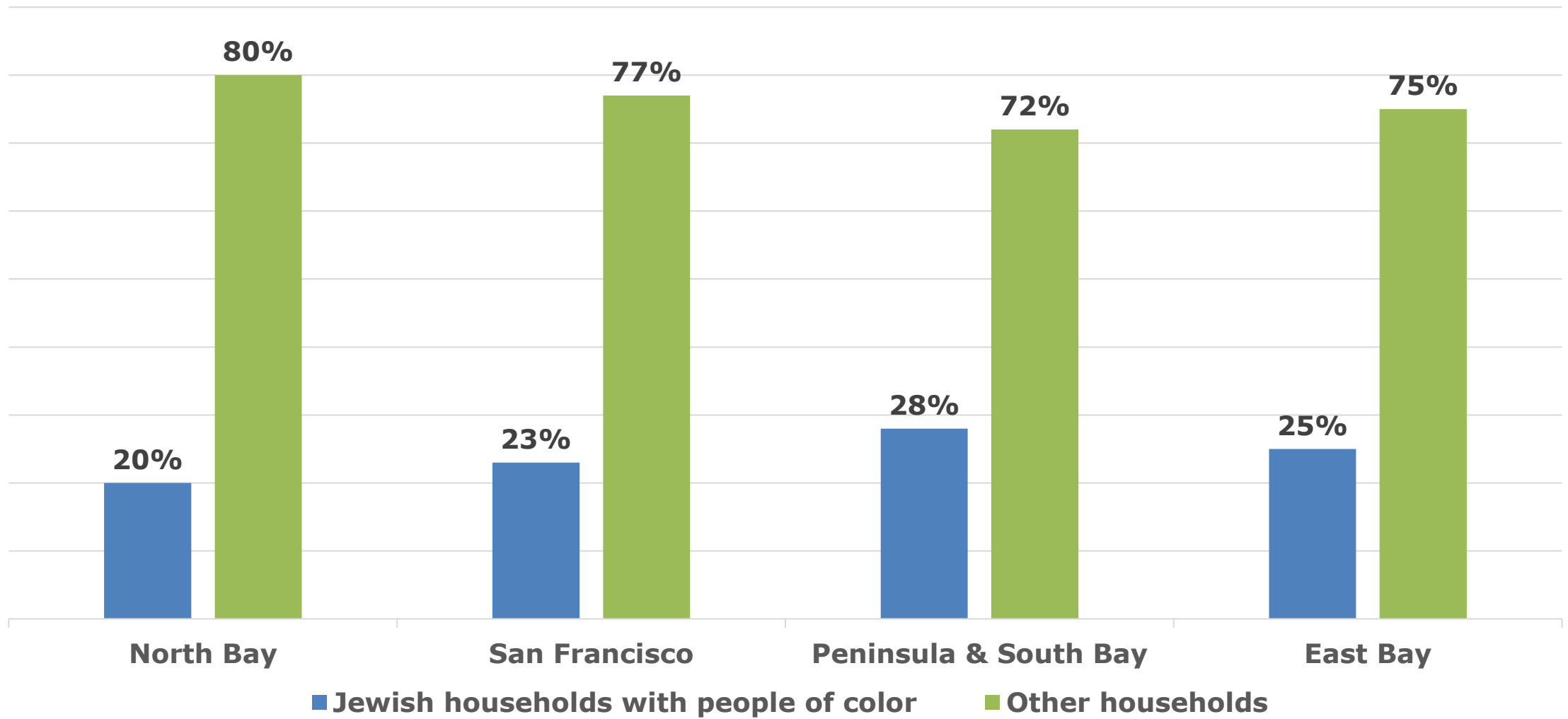

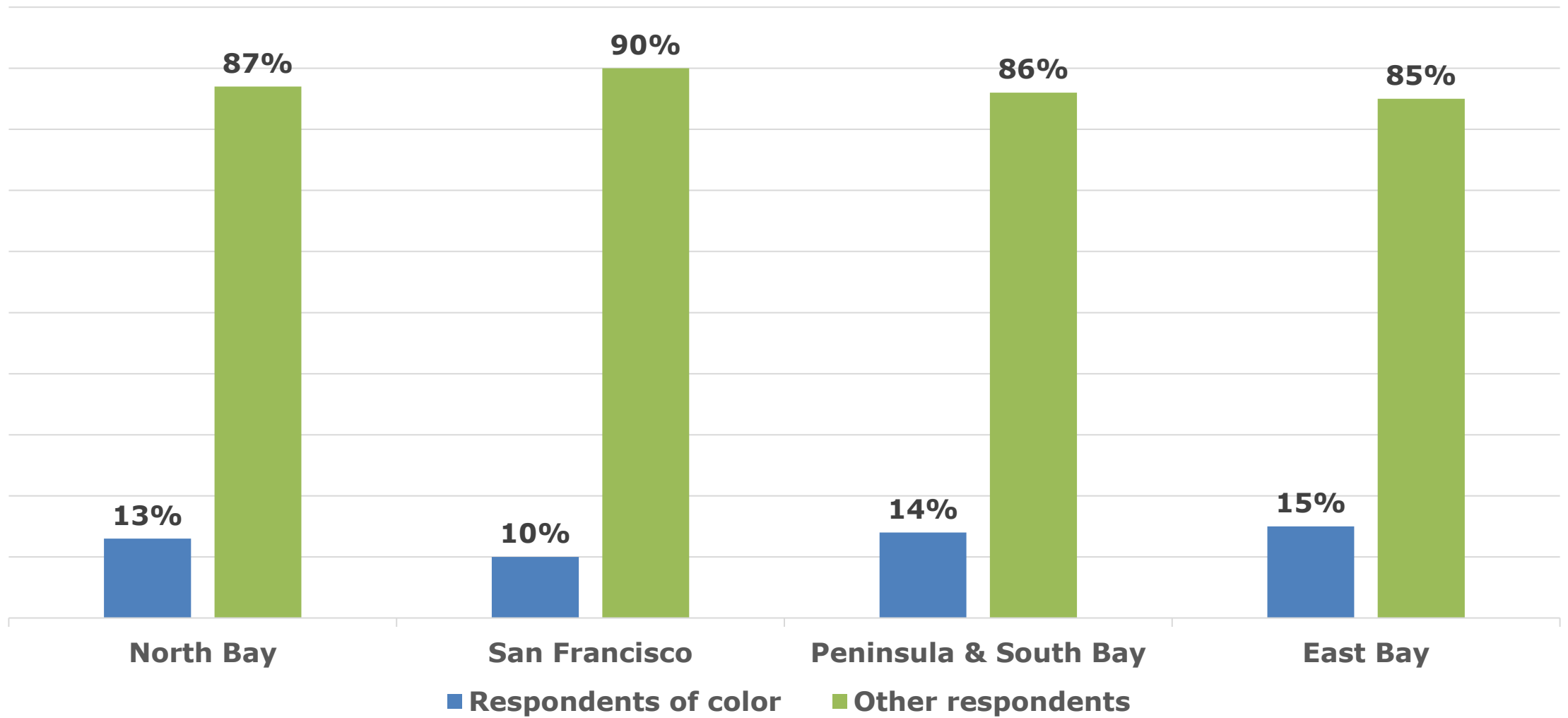
Race & Ethnicity by Region

(by household)



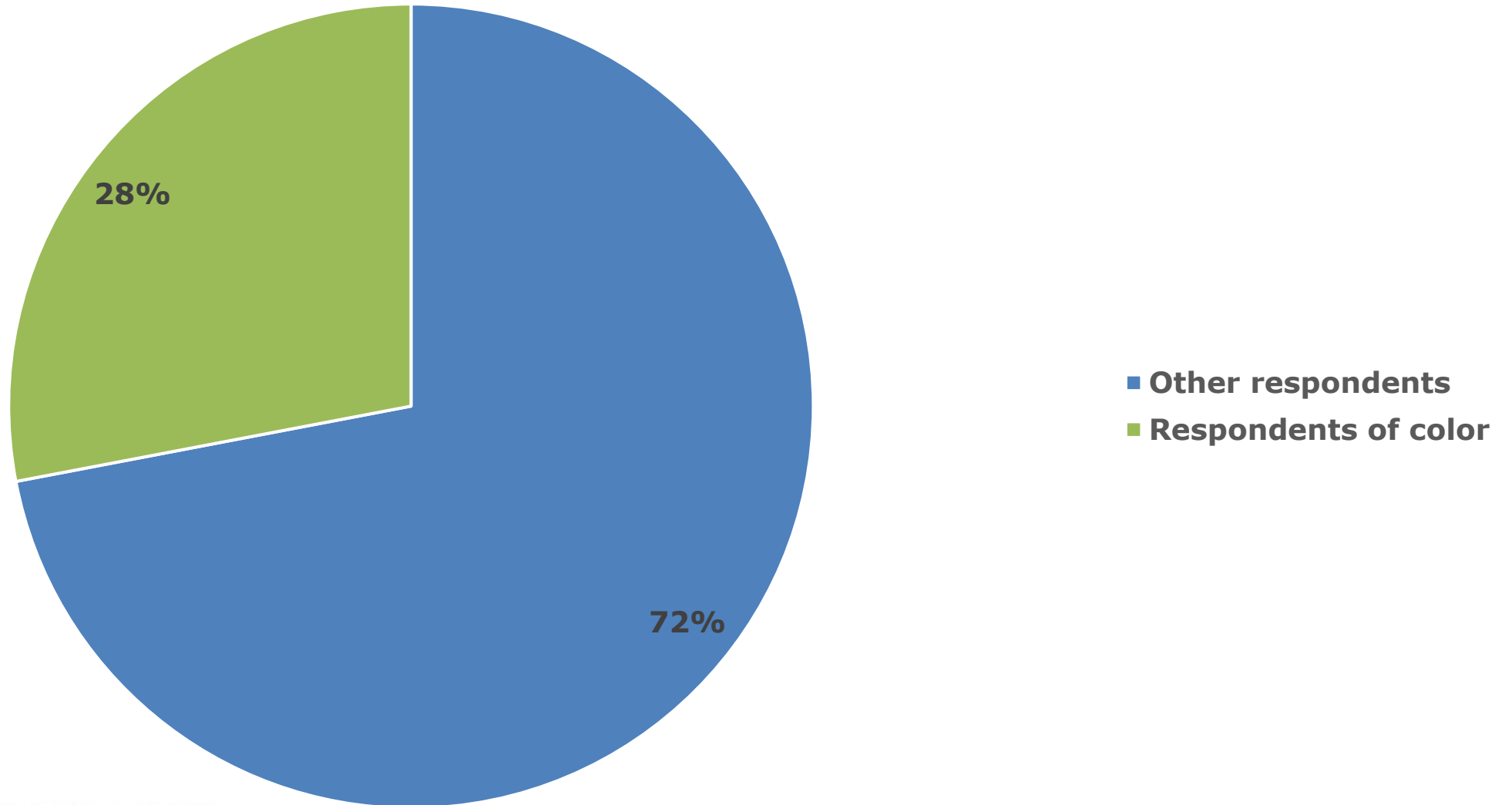
Race & Ethnicity by Region

(by Jewish respondent)

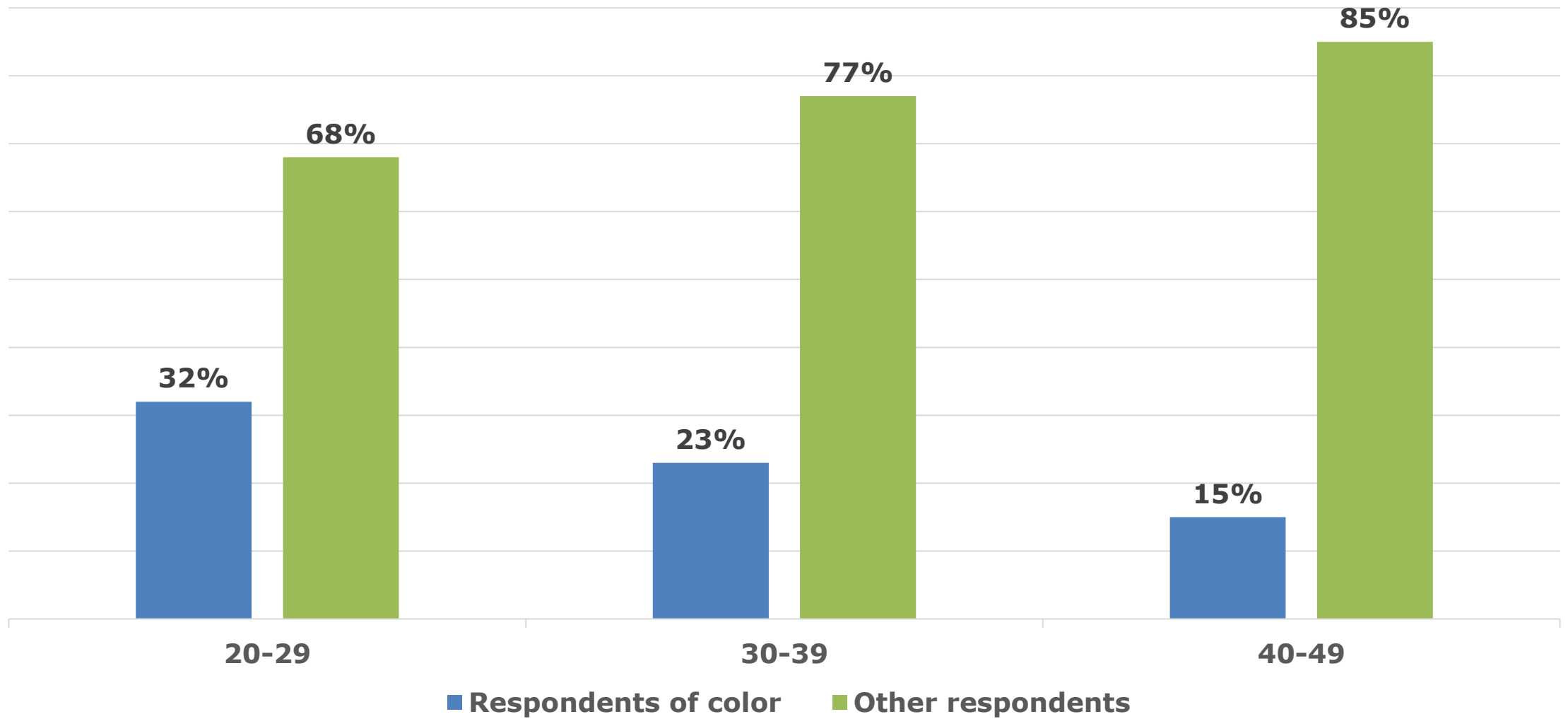


Race and Ethnicity by Young Adults Ages 18-34

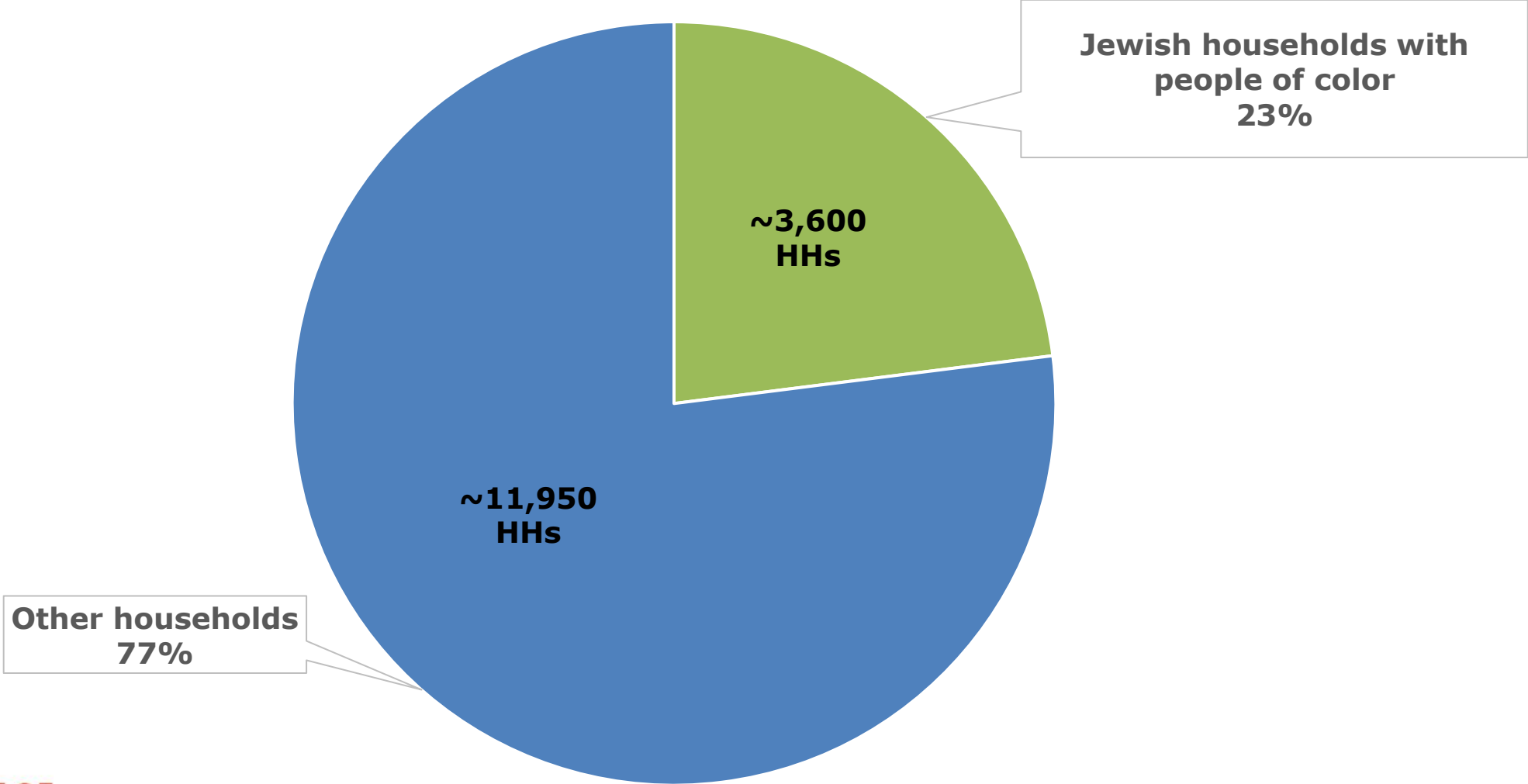

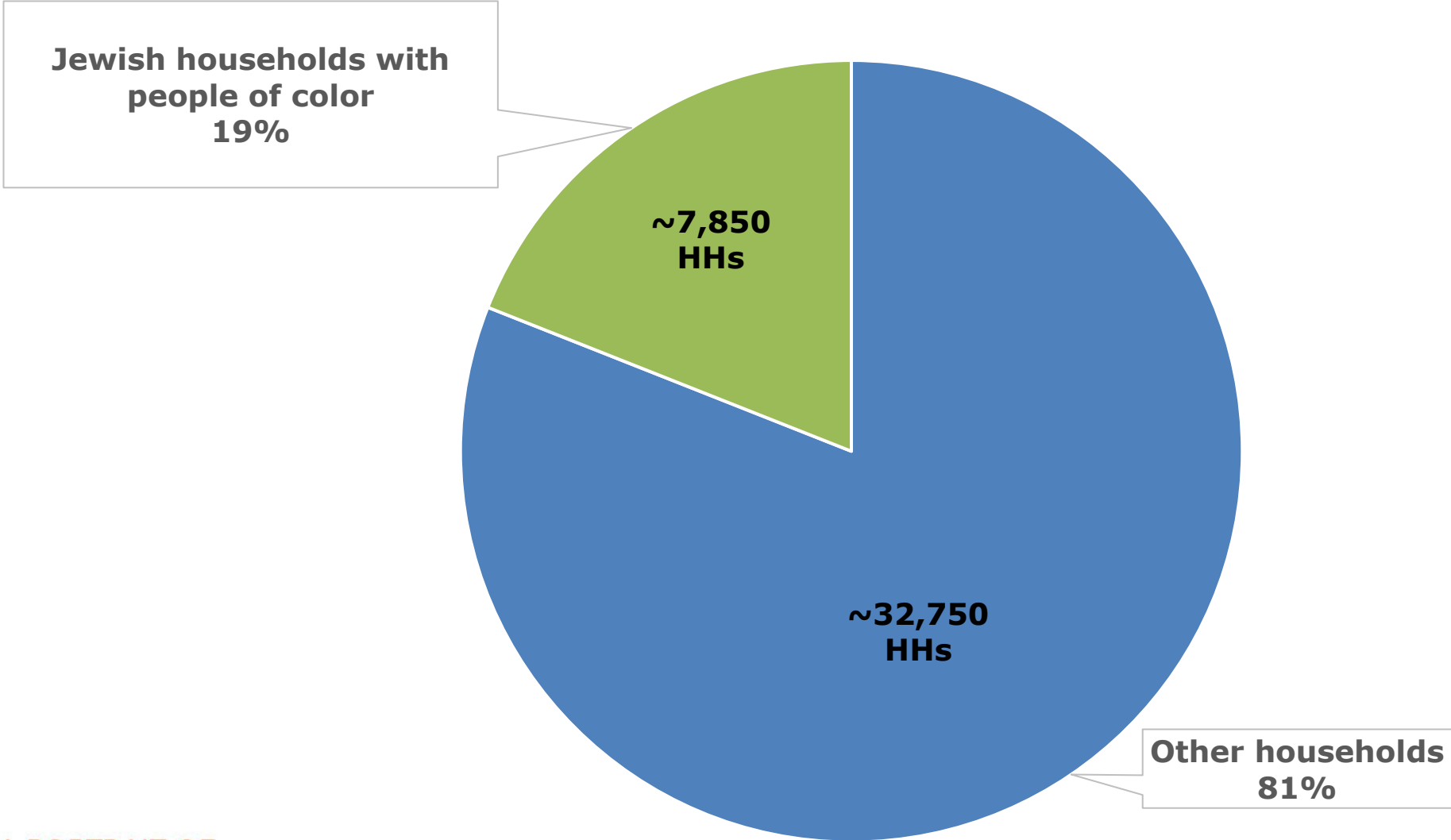
Race & Ethnicity by Respondents Under 50 (by respondent)



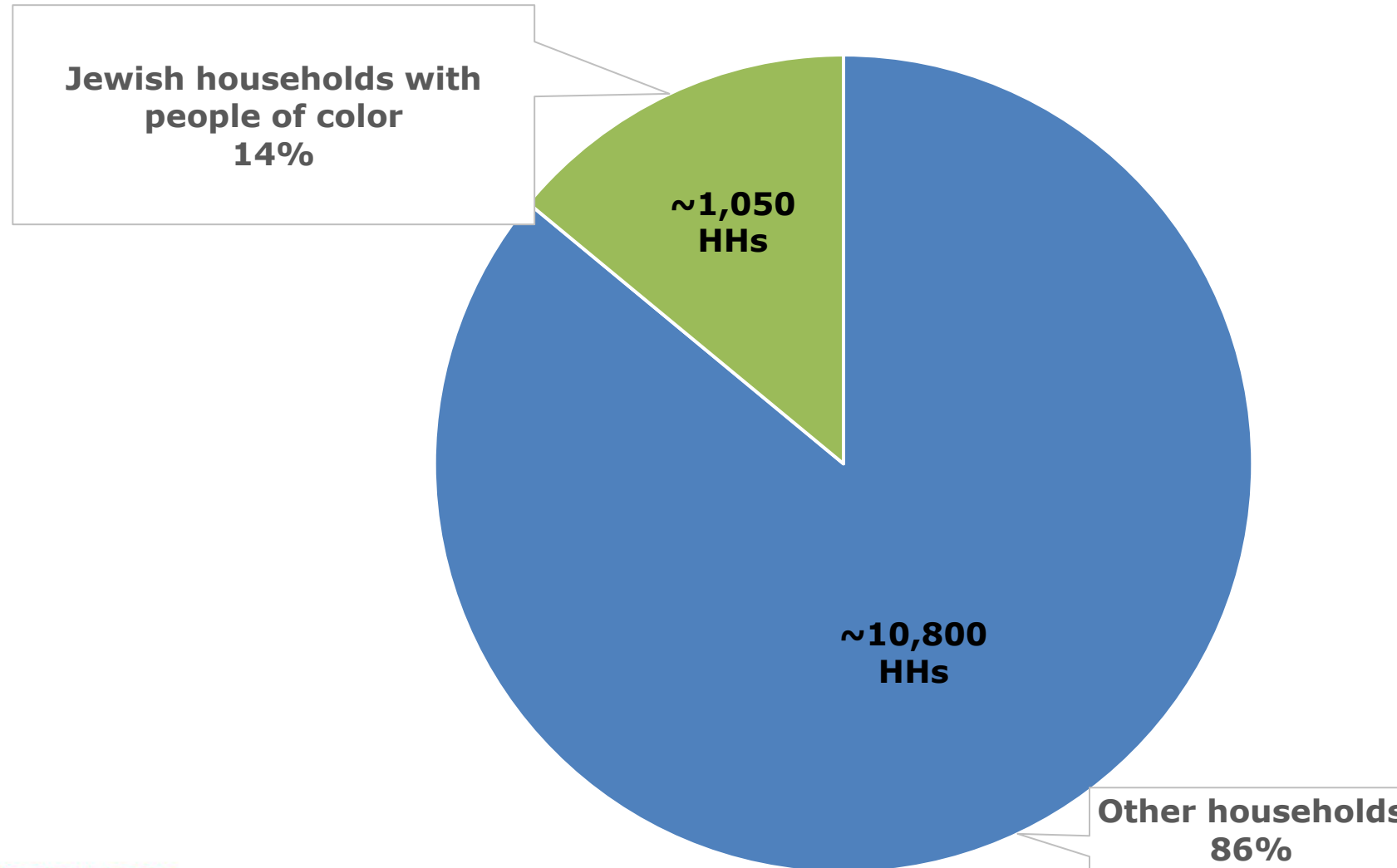
Race and Ethnicity of Households with Children Ages 0-4 (by households)



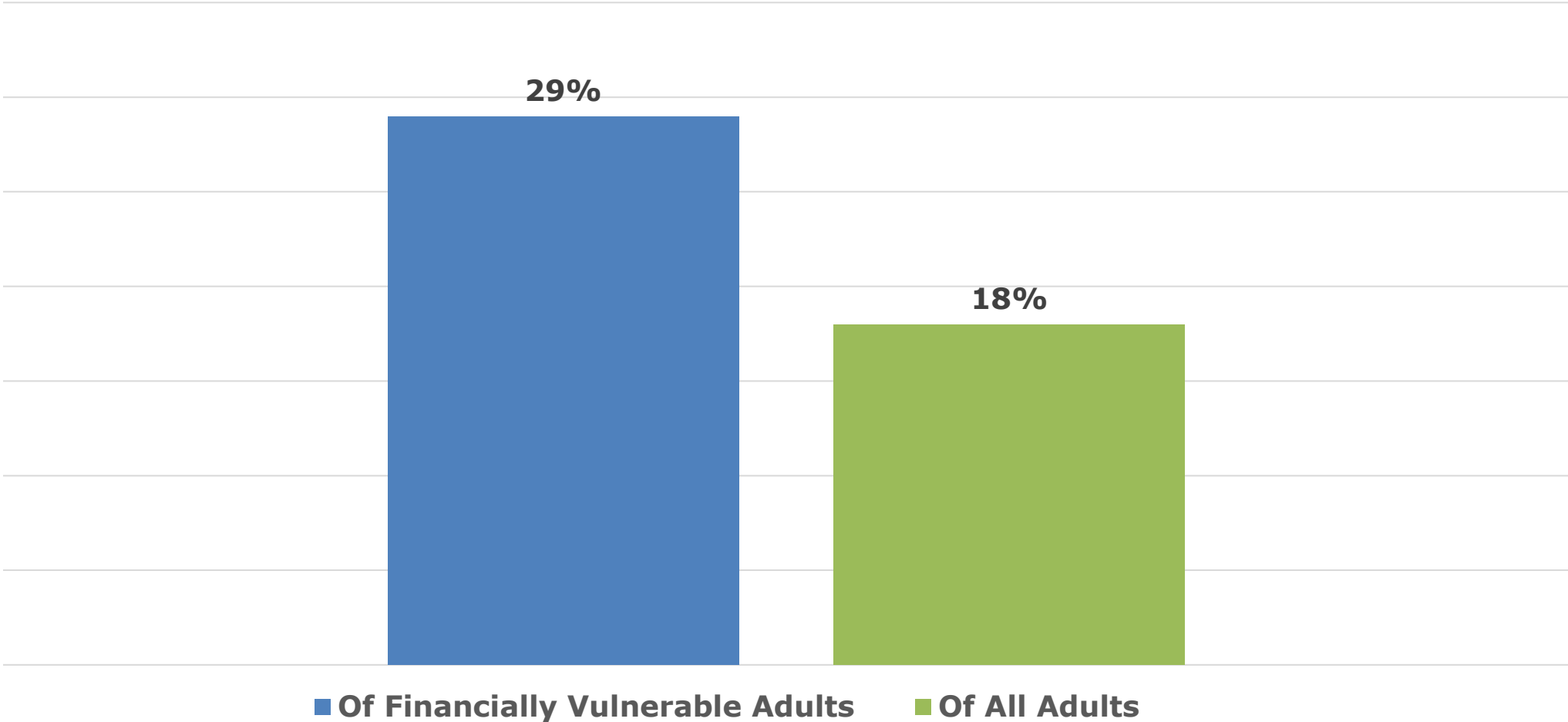
Households with Children 5-17 by Race and Ethnicity
